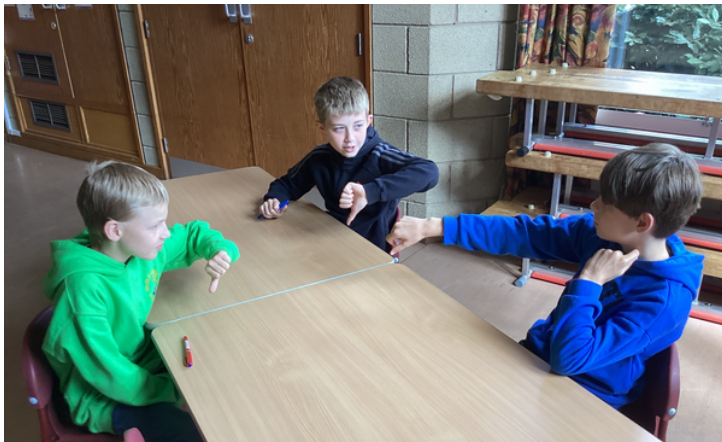
The antibullying ambassadors announced the winners and runners up for their Antibullying competition in assembly on Monday and the prizes went to:
