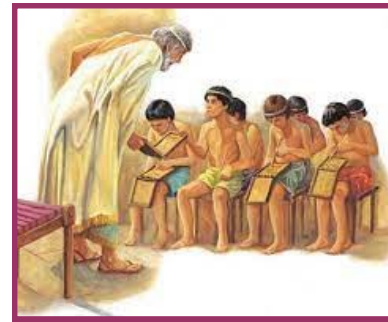

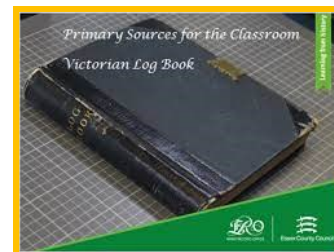
1834 Act, Poor Law Unions: They were required to provide at least three hours a day of schooling for **workhouse** children, and to appoint

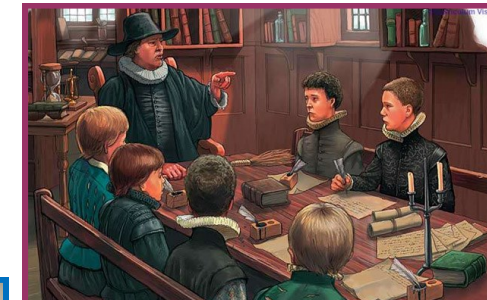
