

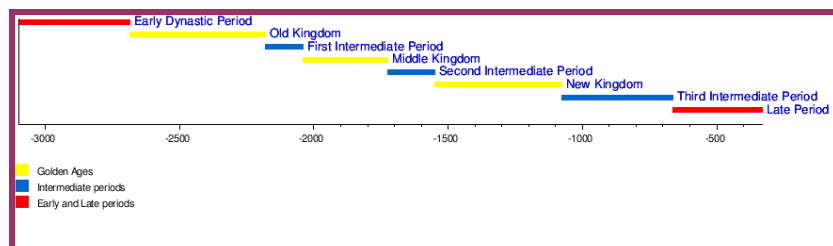
Beliefs in Ancient Egypt KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER

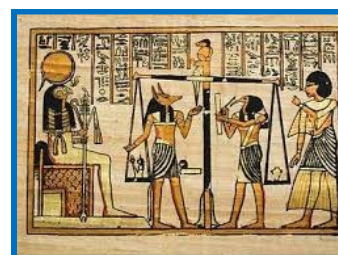

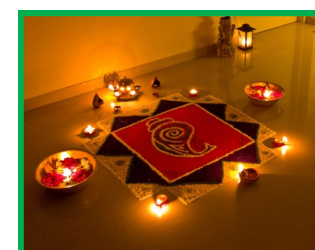
