A few reminders...

Cars should not park or stop at anytime on the yellow zigzag lines on the road outside school, even for dropping children off.

Please keep children with you and supervise them at the end of the school day. They should not be running around, in the reading shelter or on the gym.

Only blue badge holders should be using the school car park. We have a pupil dropped off in a taxi and it is becoming very congested in the carpark.

It has been brought to our attention that some cars are driving up the pavement quite quickly by the doctors on school drop off and pick up time when there are pedestrians with children walking on the pavements. Safety is paramount and younger children can not always be seen clearly in car mirrors, especially when it is a foggy morning. Please drive slowly, be aware of pedestrians and avoid mounting the pavement.
