
Parent Questionnaire for Clee Hill Community Academy: March 2024

Once again - very positive. 100% feel that their child is safe and supported.





Water bottles encouraged for all pupils - a focus on water and milk rather than sugar alternatives. SNAG - School Nutrition Action Group - Pupils involved in food choices, pupils learning more about the food standards and having a pupil voice. Design and Technology Food curriculum is predominantly savoury and a focus on healthy eating.
