Compare Clee Hill with a contrasting location

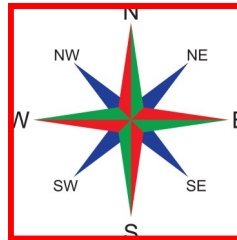
Be familiar with some of the similarities and differences of these countries in physical and human geography.

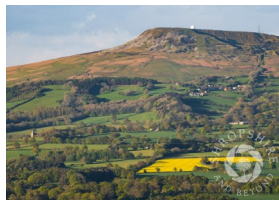


Human features of London compared to Clee Hill

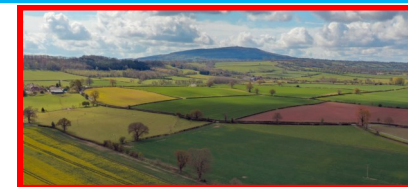


Fieldwork: visit to the park and talk about how people use recreational spaces.
