Monarchs to have lived in Ludlow Castle

From 1473—1483, Ludlow Castle was the home of Prince Edward (known as one of the 'Princes in the Tower'). He was in residence there when he learned of the death of his father, Edward IV, and assumed the title of King Edward V.



Prince Arthur (eldest son of Henry VII) spent a few months at Ludlow with his wife Catherine of Aragon before his death here on 2nd April 1502. Catherine went on to marry Arthur's brother, who became Henry VII and their daughter

Why were castles built where they were?

They were built near water / hill forts to provide good visibility over the surrounding areas.

Ludlow castle was built close to the border with Wales. This was to help protect England from attacks from the Welsh.




