## Substantive Knowledge:

During the Maya civilization (around 2000BCE to 900CE) several changes took place in Britain (Stone Age, Bronze Age, Iron Age, Celts, Romans, Anglo-Saxons, Vikings)

Up until about 200 years ago, hardly anyone knew where the Maya had settled, and no one is certain about what happened to the Mayan people.


