How has migration influenced the way we eat, listen to music, influenced our art and our streets?



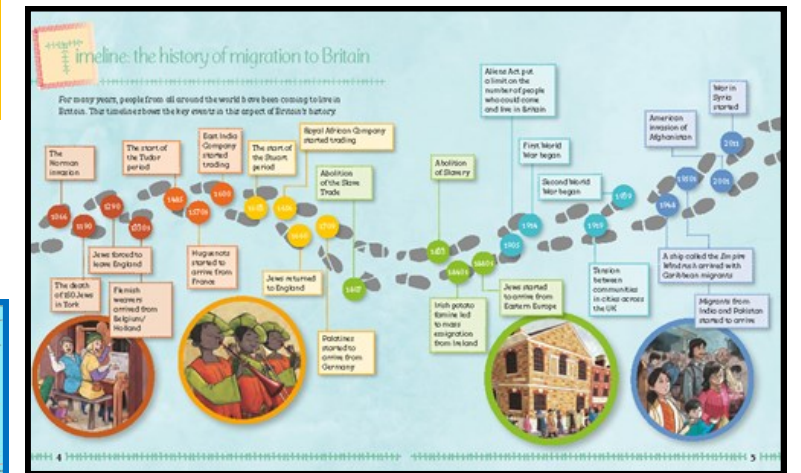
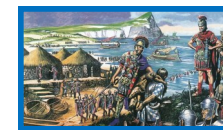
Who were the Windrush generation and why are they so important to the history of migration in Britain?

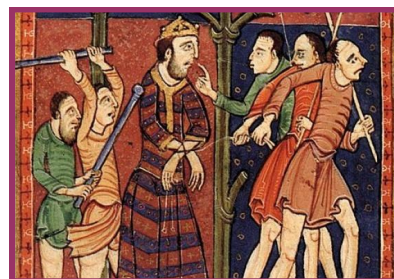
Consider different types of cause and effect for key events in history. Consider how migration led to a diverse Britain
